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

- We use lots of team, partner and peer tutoring as well as using key adults to ensure all children are learning effectively and at their level.


















### Homework – 3E

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### NAPLAN

- NAPLAN is still scheduled for term 1 this year. This is a standardised test that only tests the students on their writing, numeracy, spelling, grammar and reading. We will strive to help alleviate any anxiety around this as this will be their first time sitting the NAPLAN test.
- We don't place too much emphasis and NAPLAN and will do some practise around the tech needed as well as some timed writing.

# Tips for a great year

Contact us in the first instance if you have any concerns or questions.

Reading, reading, reading!

Daily reading with your child and asking questions about the text, ensures that they are understanding, comprehending, making predictions and identifying graphemes and high frequency words.

Repetition, repetition, repetition!

Practise multiplication facts until they can be recalled quickly and accurately

Lots of 'incidental' learning that reminds students that skills learnt at school can be transferred into everyday life.

Encouraging independence.
